


Want to help Do Good Roseville continue to provide our great programs? Come to our garage sale! Proceeds from the sale will be used to pay for future programs.

Food and drinks will be *free*, however we encourage people to share food that is special to them (e.g. from their home country). Please let us know how many will be coming by June 16 at:



3. Someone has to take the pink flamingo home and plant it in their yard to mark the next gathering.


