




Join us for our bi-monthly book club, now in it's second year!

Becoming American: A Documentary Film and Discussion Series on Our Immigration Experience Thursday, December 13, 6:30-8:30 p.m.

Join us for the exciting launch of this film series which is a grant-funded project of City Lore. Ramsey County Library is joining selected other libraries across the country in presenting **this six-part, monthly series** of films and facilitated discussions about the American immigration experience. It will be offered each month from November thru April.

Join us as we explore the historic and current tensions in Americans' acceptance of immigrants. This program includes a screening of **Welcome to Shelbyville**, followed by discussion moderated by Professor Dina Gavrilos.

The Library is partnering with Do Good Roseville, Shoreview Human Rights Commission, and the League of Women Voters Roseville Area. Additional funding for this program series is provided by the Friends of the Ramsey County Libraries. This is a project of City Lore in collaboration with the Immigration and Ethnic History Society and the International Coalition of the Sites of Conscience. The project has been made possible by a major grant from the National Endowment for the Humanities: Exploring the Human Endeavor.
