Demystifying Hospice Care**



Join Do Good Roseville and the Roseville Housing Network to play "Game of Zones". It's a fun and interactive way to learn about one of the most boring, complicated, but fundamental aspects of land use: zoning!

Terms like "setback," "floor area ratio," and "variance" are well known to planning staff and developers but start using this jargon with any person on the street and you will get a glassy-eyed stare in return. Game of Zones helps people understand how the zoning code determines whether we have homes for everyone!

Working together with a neighbor or two, your team gets a parcel of land, families to house on that parcel, and building materials. Based on the zoning requirements, can you create enough housing for the families? Give it your best and take it to the planning staff for review. With a roll of the die, you might find your project has neighborhood support or that you face a lawsuit. The team able to house the most people in the play time wins!

Grab a neighbor and join us to play the Game of Zones: the most fun you'll have learning about the municipal code!
