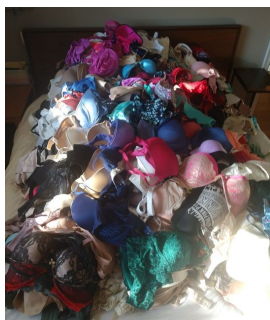


#### Little Red Bin Collections
