



In the news we see many stories of the homeless encampments in Minneapolis and St. Paul but those are just part of the story. Homelessness refers to a condition wherein people lack "a fixed, regular, and adequate nighttime residence" as defined by The [McKinney-Vento Homeless Assistance Act](#). Join us to hear from three experts in the field to learn how this impacts our local community, what local organizations are doing, and how you can help.

Our panelists include:

- Michelle Decker Gerrard, Senior Research Manager & Director MN Homeless study for Wilder Research. The statewide study is conducted every three years.
- Loni Aadalen, Continuum of Care Coordinator for Heading Home Ramsey. HHR is a coalition of social service providers, housing providers, philanthropic partners, business, community, government and citizens working together to create and implement cost effective solutions to ending homelessness.
- Michael Stanefski, lead social worker from Roseville Area Schools, who helps coordinate the McKinney-Vento services for students.

They have more than 15 different topping options, and you choose the ramen according to the topping, or you choose topping according to the ramen. The main course in Ichiddo Noodle are both Japanese and Chinese style noodle, noodle soup and fried rice.
