

It is with the heaviest of hearts that we share the sudden passing of Don Eubanks. The State of MN declared March 21 as Donald Eubanks Day for all his many contributions across the State. We have included the full proclamation below, but Don's death was personal for us. We want to tell you about him and his impact on our lives here in Roseville, where he too lived.

First and foremost, Don was our friend. When Don came to a friends' gathering of any type, it always felt like a gift because he liked to have fun and he was such a great storyteller. When he spoke, everyone would invariably turn to listen to him.

Etienne said "There's no social Justice movement in Roseville without Donald Eubanks" and it's true that Don had an immeasurable impact on Do Good Roseville.

Sherry first met Don when they served on the task force Imagine Roseville, which was created by the City of Roseville after the murder of Philando Castile. Sherry said "I was blown away every time he talked because he clearly and powerfully spoke truth to power."

At that time, Do Good Roseville had only done a couple of volunteer events, but we knew we had to do something as a reaction to Philando's killing. We learned of a film series called "Race: the Power of an Illusion" and we thought maybe, somehow, we could show it. Sherry asked Don if he would moderate a discussion on the series with us and he said "No. You can do it, but I'll be there to support you." It was so scary and yet so powerful for us to do it ourselves. It pushed us to be actively engaged, rather than being bystanders. That's the work of a great mentor, and he played that role for us from that point on.

After the Race series, our social justice work continued with Don's guidance and participation. We were honored when he shared his life experiences as part of the Ask an Indigenous Person panel, and Don was instrumental in creating our Indigenous MN series where he was the speaker on Sovereignty.

We know that our Juneteenth event was very important to him. From our very first event at a park shelter with friends to joining the Juneteenth Planning Committee as the event grew. We have a hard time envisioning a future Juneteenth celebration without Don.

Don was inspiring when teaching a class or speaking on the Counter Stories podcast, (www.counterstoriespodcast.org). I can personally attest to how important any conversation with Don could be. I was a very naïve white girl when I met Don. I'd never had a friend of color nor met an Indigenous person. Of course, Don was used to dealing with clueless people like me, but still he patiently guided me as my eyes were opened to all the injustice around me. When I thought I had something figured out, he'd nudge me along with another story or another fact that would open my eyes a little more. He never gave up on me.

You will see in the proclamation the important positions Don has held. The number of people he knew, helped, and taught is uncountable across the State. Yet if there is one lesson that sticks out most it was Don telling me how there are things I can do just by virtue of having white skin that he could never do - especially when it comes to confronting authority like the City of Roseville. I will strive to always remember that.

# Thursday, March 21, 2024, was proclaimed as

#### **DON EUBANKS DAY**

#### in the state of Minnesota

WHEREAS Donald (Don) Ross Eubanks was born on November 26, 1954, in Minneapolis, attended North and Central High Schools, and earned degrees from Minneapolis Community College, Metropolitan State University, and the University of Minnesota; and

WHEREAS Don met his person, Mara, in the early 1980s at the Oz Disco in St. Paul, when her dance moves sparked love at first sight; and

WHEREAS Don worked with Ramsey Action Programs and Fathers Resource Center, where he led support groups and expanded programs to Black, Native and Asian communities, but he considered being a loving father to his children, Rafael and Gabriella, his first real job; and

WHEREAS Don was an avid golfer and angler, he played football at Macalester College and later joined in the joy of sports that his children loved; and

WHEREAS Don dedicated his career to serving and helping people – as a mentor, elder, advocate, and teacher, and through his career as a social worker, chemical health director at the Minnesota Department of Human Services and associate professor at Metropolitan State; and

WHEREAS Don realized his lifelong dream to serve his people in 1998 when he became commissioner of Health and Human Services for the Mille Lacs Band of Ojibwe, a role he served twice for more than six years; and


WHEREAS Don helped create elder-assisted living facilities at Mille Lacs and the "Circle of Health" to help band members with medical insurance. He also served in the cabinet when Mille Lacs won a historic U.S. Supreme Court Case in 1999 to retain hunting and fishing rights;

WHEREAS Don brought his Black and Indigenous identity to Counter Stories, a program that offers challenging and necessary conversations about race and culture, where Don used his well-known penchant for storytelling to ably share his own experiences and perspectives; and

WHEREAS Don Eubanks was many things to many people. Most importantly, he was a beloved father, significant other, brother, friend, and advocate for change, and he will be remembered and loved forever.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, TIM WALZ, Governor of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim Thursday, March 21, 2024, as:

# New DGR Initiative: Friends of Central Park Elementary




