Here's a chance to help our elementary students get off to a great academic start! In Roseville Area Schools, AVID has been used with great success in high school and middle school to provide direct support for students in grades K-16 who have the potential of becoming first-generation college students. It is now being implemented in the elementary schools. You can find out more about the AVID program here. For more about the elementary school program, you can view this video.

An important tool for AVID students is a Case-It organizational tool used to support organization for all subjects. Last year was the first year the 6th graders used them and feedback was very positive. The first year students are introduced to the program they need to have a Case-it - which can then be used for subsequent years. This year approximately 500 students will need a Case-it, and Do Good Roseville wants to help by asking you to purchase 1 or more Case-its. Roseville Walking Audits - Ongoing



We had a great first meeting to learn about the Roseville Walking Audit, and we have already done a few test audits. Using thetoolkit as a guide, everyone who has done them has learned a lot, and has begun looking at our streets in a different way!

Where are people walking and crossing roads? Do they use designated crosswalks? Do drivers appear to follow the rules? Are the light buttons accessible? There's so much to observe!

Bob Bierschied, who is leading this initiative, has led a series of initial audits, with the goal for a group of people to learn how to do an audit so they can lead an audit of other areas, and also to figure out what makes a good area to evaluate (size, timing, etc).

Based on what we learn, Bob will decide on the next set of audit areas to audit. Then around Labor Day we will send out a new sign-up sheet for people to select the area or areas they would like to be responsible for auditing. They will be able to choose the date and time that works best. The goal is to complete these audits this Fall, to be done before Thanksgiving.
