



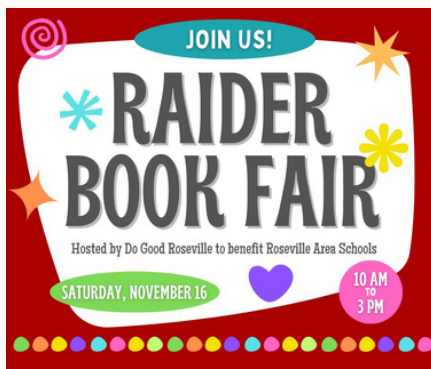

We have a great opportunity for you to turn your shopping into funds to buy books for Roseville Schools - and it won't cost you anything extra! It's so simple!

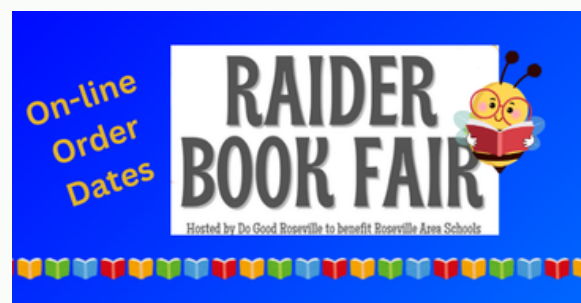

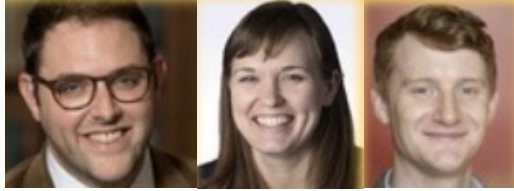


Disappearing Local News - Part 2

Roseville Resident Naomi Krueger, a self-described Roseville citizen Journalist, is taking steps to address the lack of local news by creating an online newsletter. The Roseville Reader specializes in local election information, Roseville government news, Roseville School Board news, and curating relevant articles about matters relevant to Roseville from other sources.

From the About page of the Roseville Reader: "Since Lillie News and its local paper The Roseville Review went out of business in 2019, Roseville, Minnesota has been without a community newspaper. While major news lands in the Pioneer Press or the Minnesota Star Tribune, or statewide television and radio reports, the smaller stories and information about what's happening in our city go underreported. Without independent journalism reporting on Roseville on a regular basis, community members are left without a local news source they can trust. The Roseville Reader is one response to this hole in the heart of our community."
