# Scholarship Design Elements

Scholarship requirements can range from the very simple to complex. The following represents the variety of eligibility requirements from current Roseville Area Community Scholarships. Please choose or design eligibility requirements that align with the values, goals, and priorities of your organization!

## Eligibility requirement examples:

- Specific group of students you want to help (e.g. underrepresented minorities, first-generation students, students in a particular field)
- Academic criteria (GPA, intended major, type of post-secondary program, etc.)
- Area of focus/study or intended career OR area of passion/special interest
- Demographic factors
- Extracurricular activities or leadership experience
- Community involvement
- Financial need

## Application requirement ideas:

- Write an essay
- Provide a transcript or resume
- Letter of recommendation

## Examples from previous Roseville Area Community Scholarships

**Description:** Students who value Community Involvement

**Requirements:** Write a 250 word, short answer on how you are involved in your community and why you deserve this scholarship.

**Description:** Student must be going to school with intent to enter into a mental health field.

**Requirements:** Essay on educational intent in a mental health field and why it's important to you.

**Description:** For students who are Little Canada residents or those who have affiliations with the Little Canada Recreation Association.

**Requirements:**

- 1) Student MUST be a Little Canada Resident or those who have affiliations with the Little Canada Recreation Association.
- 2) Student MUST attend a Vocational, College or University in the fall of their graduating year.
- 3) Student MUST be on track to graduate, GPA of 2.5 or higher, be involved in extra curricular activities or have apparent affiliation to LCRA, volunteer service to the LCRA and or surrounding communities.
- 5) Student must know where they are planning to go for Higher Education.
- 4) ESSAY: On a PDF, include a resume focused on volunteerism and a short essay (200-500) words explaining why you are an exceptional candidate for this scholarship. Include your accomplishments and extra curricular activities including any volunteer service that you have been involved in.
