Currently there are no emergency overnight care services for children in the St. Paul or Ramsey County area, and there is an exceptional need for this service in the area. STAR House will provide children aged birth through six years a temporary home for up to 72 hours at a time and caregivers with resources they need to achieve stability and ultimately thrive.
